
# Aspiring Respectful Resilient



## Ms Knight Writes

Happy Thursday 
 I am not sure where that week went, but here we are again!

It is a busy but lovely time at school as the year winds up. Our teachers are sticking with their learning routines and there is still lots of reading, spelling, writing, maths, times tables, and knowledge happening in classes every day. Plus a few Christmas activities sneaking in! Students thrive on routines. We also know there is a bit of 'learning loss' over the summer break and we try to minimize that by teaching up to that last week. It is a lovely time of the year as we reflect on all the amazing things we have achieved this year, and to see the growth and maturity in students is incredible. Our Year 6's are well and truly ready for Year 7, and it is exciting to see our new Foundation students coming in for transition days. This makes our current Foundation students seem incredibly grown up!



Attendance: A huge shoutout to the whole school community for your amazing work on this over 2024 and 2025. We have some students on 100% attendance (Jack and Lila) and some on 99% (students who might have gone home early or missed one day). That is an incredible achievement. Lots of students are away for completely legitimate reasons – having their tonsils out, having the flu, breaking their arm – these are all reasons not to come to school! It is the other days missed that we worry about and they can sneak up on families. Please check your child's attendance and keep that goal of 10 days per year in mind. Of course we have alternative plans for our students who need extra support. Being at school every day is hard for our neurodiverse students. The noise, movement, changes, and social demands are exhausting. We work with families on individual plans for those students. Being at school for four successful days is a much better option for some students than having a fifth really hard day. But for most of our children, we know that school is associated with so many positive life outcomes. Many families have worked hard on attendance and it does take work – early bedtimes, organisation, routines – teachers know that too, as we have to do the same things! You would be surprised to know how early some teachers go to bed – sometimes earlier than students! Thank you for all your hard work on attendance and keep it up.





**Outdoor Swimming:** There were some updated regulations released regarding school swimming programs. The ratio of qualified staff at our outdoor program doesn't meet these regulations and unfortunately, we have had to cancel this program for 2025. The updated regulations were created in response to some incidents with school swimming programs. Training more staff as Austswim Teachers is the longer-term plan as we would love to continue to run the outdoor program. All of those families who have paid the \$25 for the program this year will have that credited to their account. For Year 6's, the amount will be credited to siblings accounts, and for those families finishing up at AWPS this year, Tianee will organise a refund. We apologise for this change, but it is very important that swimming (which is classified as a 'high risk' school activity) is run safely, by staff with the correct qualifications, in a way that is fully compliant with department policies.





**Zooper Doopers:** We can't quite align the hot days with zooper dooper sales! Just a reminder that these are for sale on Tuesday and Wednesday for the next two weeks, until the end of the year at \$1 each. Students can only purchase one per day.

**Transition:** The state-wide transition day is next Tuesday. Year 6 students going to Ararat College in 2026 should go straight there. Year 6 students going to Marian College in 2026 are very welcome to come to school or have a rest day at home. Our Marian College Year 6's have already had their transition day, and our day on Tuesday is focussed on 2026. Students are very welcome, but a rest day is fine too.

**Reports:** These will be handed out on the last day of the school year. If your child is not at school that day, families can arrange for someone else to collect their child/rens reports. It is expensive to post reports now, so that is no longer something we offer as an option. If you are unable to collect your child/ren's report then we will hold them at school, and they can be collected at the start of 2026.

**Family Accounts:** Tianee has sent out final accounts for this year via email. PLEASE check your emails addresses and even your junk mail folder to make sure you do not miss yours. Only families owing money have been emailed an account. We know so many of our families are incredibly happy with the programs and opportunities Ararat West Primary School gives to students. These things only happen because the school is able to pay for them, and we need your support in terms of paying your school contributions! Please call Tianee to arrange part or full payment as soon as possible.

**2026:** As you would all know, I was here at AWPS while Mr Keilar was in a department role over 2024 and 2025. So my time at West is coming to an end. I have moved schools quite a bit over my career (2 schools as a teacher then another 4 schools as a Principal – so 6 schools in total) and being here at Ararat West has been a delight. I will write a bit of a proper goodbye in the last newsletter, but I am just reminding everyone that Mr Keilar will be back at his school for the start of 2026. I am busy tidying the office to make sure he has a nice clean space to move back into ③. I will say a big thankyou in the last newsletter, but it really has been a wonderful 18 months – I have loved my time here!

Year 6 students from our school have recently undertaken an education tour of the national capital. Students were given the opportunity to


participate in a variety of educational programs with a focus on Australia's history, culture, heritage and democracy.




We invite everyone to join us by donating unwrapped gifts at our office from the 24th November until the 19th of December.
